Social Security Services & Benefits Remain Intact during Government Shutdown



Services are still available with your online *my* Social Security account. As Congress works to pass a federal budget, the government is currently shut down. We know this raises questions. We have answers.

Will the Shutdown Affect SSDI and SSI Payments? No, it will not affect payments. If you receive benefits, payments will continue without interruption, on time, with no changes to payment dates.

What Services are Available Online? Online services are constantly expanding to give you freedom and control when conducting business with Social Security. Today, you can use your *my* Social Security account to:

- Request replacement Social Security/Medicare cards.
- Apply for benefits/access benefit verification letters.
- Check your application or appeal status.
- Access your Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) notice.
- Change your address.
- Set up or change direct deposit.
- Print your 1099.
- View your latest statement/review earnings history.

Are Local Offices Open? Yes, but not all in-person services are available. We encourage you to use your personal *my* Social Security account (at *secure.ssa.gov*) to easily access SSA services and benefits online.



Eligibility

To be eligible for a grant, a small business must serve customers onsite at a location within one-quarter mile of the Purple Line tracks, be open and operational at that location since July 1, 2023, be in good standing with the Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation and be current on federal and state taxes.

Authorities' Tips to Spot Hidden Card Skimmers after Major Baltimore Operation

Twenty-two illegal skimming devices were removed from Baltimore businesses during an operation by the US Secret Service (USSS). On October 22 and 23, the USSS visited 493 businesses alongside local law enforcement; they inspected more than 3,000 point of sale terminals, gas pumps and ATMs, officials said.

The operation was part of a series of similar efforts across the county that prevented an estimated loss of nearly \$22.9 million, according to the Secret Service.

"The US Secret Service, and our law enforcement and state agency partners, remain committed to combating EBT fraud and payment card skimming in Maryland and throughout the country," said Brian McDonough, Special Agent in Charge of the USSS's Baltimore Field Office. "This proactive approach allows us to identify and remove skimming devices that target our nation's most vulnerable populations. I'm proud of the great work of our personnel and our partners during this operation."

What is Card Skimming?

Card skimming occurs when criminals install hidden devices onto ATMS, gas pumps, and other point-of-sale terminals to steal card data and PIN entries.

Using the information, scammers can then create fake payment cards and make unauthorized purchases or steal money from bank accounts, according to the FBI.

Scammers can also use the skimmers to steal information from EBT cards and encode that data onto another card with a magnetic strip, according to the USSS. The FBI reports skimming costs financial institutions and consumers more than \$1 billion annually.

How to Identify Card Skimmers

Skimming devices are designed to look like part of a card reader and can often be found in tourist areas. Users are advised to inspect ATMs, point-of-sale terminals, and other card readers: look for alignment issues or anything that makes the card reader stick out at an odd angle.

The USSS advises citizens to look for anything loose, crooked, damaged or scratched, and to not use a card reader with giveaway details including:

- If the device feels wiggly or detachable.
- If the keys' backlight isn't visible or is faint.
- If the keys have an unusual thickness.
- Keys that feel sticky or spongy when pressed.
- A wider space below the keys, or wider borders overall on the machine.



Use tap-to-pay or chip technology instead of inserting a debit or credit card into a card reader. When using a debit card at a gas station, officials suggest running it as a credit card to avoid entering a PIN.

ATM Skimming

ATM skimmers secretly record bank account data, when a user inserts an ATM card into the machine.

Criminals encode the stolen data onto a blank card, to loot the customer's account.


- **2) Skimmer.** The skimmer fits over the regular card reader and is more convex than the original.
- **3) Keypad overlay.** This is placed on top of the regular keypad; circuitry records your keystrokes.

Maryland Veterans Burial Benefits



If you are a servicemember or veteran, please know MD owes a tremendous debt of gratitude for your service and sacrifice.

While it's never easy to think about, it's important to plan ahead: one option to consider is applying for burial at one of Maryland's Veterans Cemeteries.

Qualified veterans, along with eligible family members, receive a burial plot, grave liner, headstone, and burial services at no cost. Veterans can apply in advance by submitting a Pre-Interment Application to reserve space in a Maryland state veterans cemetery. Additionally, National Guard members, reservists, and eligible family members are authorized for burial in state veteran's cemeteries, with a fee of \$1,002 for these interments.

As well, for a veteran buried in private cemetery, the VA provides a standard issue headstone, marker or medallion, free of charge. Eligibility requirements are different for this benefit (va.gov/burials-memorials/memorial-items/headstones-markers-medallions) but combat service is not required. Spouses/dependents are ineligible for benefits at nonmilitary burial grounds.



The dementia journey is challenging. By

adhering to three golden rules — **don't ask direct questions**, **listen to the person and learn from them**, **and don't contradict**—you can create a compassionate, respectful environment. In MD, more than 127,200 people are living with Alzheimer's, with 258,000 caregivers dedicating 292 million hours of unpaid care valued at \$7 billion.

This month's purpose is to educate about Alzheimer's, its symptoms, and its impact on families. Early diagnosis is key: talk to your doctor about a PET scan if you have symptoms or family history. In 2023, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) expanded coverage of brain amyloid positron emission tomography (PET) imaging for the diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease.

Mama & Baby Bus: Mobile Health Unit

In the October issue of *Newswire* we featured The Mama and Baby Mobile Health Unit's flu shot clinics. The mobile unit also provides free quality health care to uninsured and under-insured women who are pregnant/of childbearing age. It has two private exam rooms and is staffed by experienced certified nurse midwives (CNMs).

The Mama and Baby Mobile Health Unit travels to University of Maryland Capital service areas throughout PG County, and Wards 7 and 8 in DC, to deliver health services for women and babies:



- Wellness exams and overall health education
- Pregnancy testing
- Pregnancy care education
- Birth control consultation
- Infant care/well child visits
- Maternal and child health education
- Care coordination and social support services

Immigration Rights & Resources

If you or someone you know has immigration issues, call the Amica Center immediately. Once a person is transferred out of state, it's difficult to locate/assist them. Early contact is critical to ensure they receive help and protection.




