On November 15, last year, the time capsule was closed at a reflective event held at Sis's Tavern

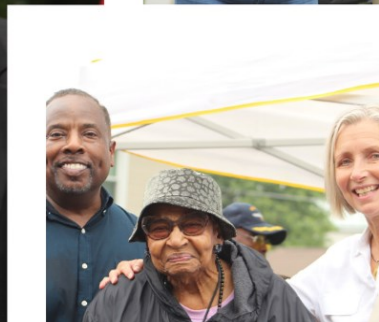
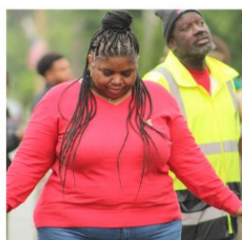

MD Schools' Academic Recovery

Think falling scores in US schools began with the pandemic? Research shows it started in 2003 with the federal education law No Child Left Behind. But, we're on the rebound academically.



Maryland's Academic Scorecard

The 2025 Education Scorecard recognizes Maryland as a national leader in academic recovery. The comprehensive report was released by researchers at Harvard University, Stanford University, and Dartmouth College. The Scorecard highlights milestones in Maryland's post-pandemic recovery:

- **National Rankings:** Out of the states analyzed, Maryland ranks 3rd out of 35 states in reading recovery and 5th out of 38 states in math recovery.
- **Tackling Chronic Absenteeism:** Maryland has seen a significant drop in chronic absenteeism, falling from 31.1% in 2022 down to 25.5% in 2025.
- **Gains in reading:** The use of the 'science of reading' and phonics is working; Baltimore City and Frederick and Worcester Counties are outperforming peers.
- **Math gains:** Anne Arundel and St. Mary's counties lead the state in increased math performance, while Dorchester and Harford counties lead in reading gains.

Despite gains, students are still more than half a grade level below 2019 levels in math.

Gov. Moore: "Maryland's students, educators and families have demonstrated incredible resilience, and today, the data proves that our state is leading the national comeback in public education. While we celebrate meaningful progress, the work is not finished. We will continue to invest in our schools, continue our progress to close the teacher shortage, and continue to ensure Maryland delivers on our promise to have the best public schools in the entire country."

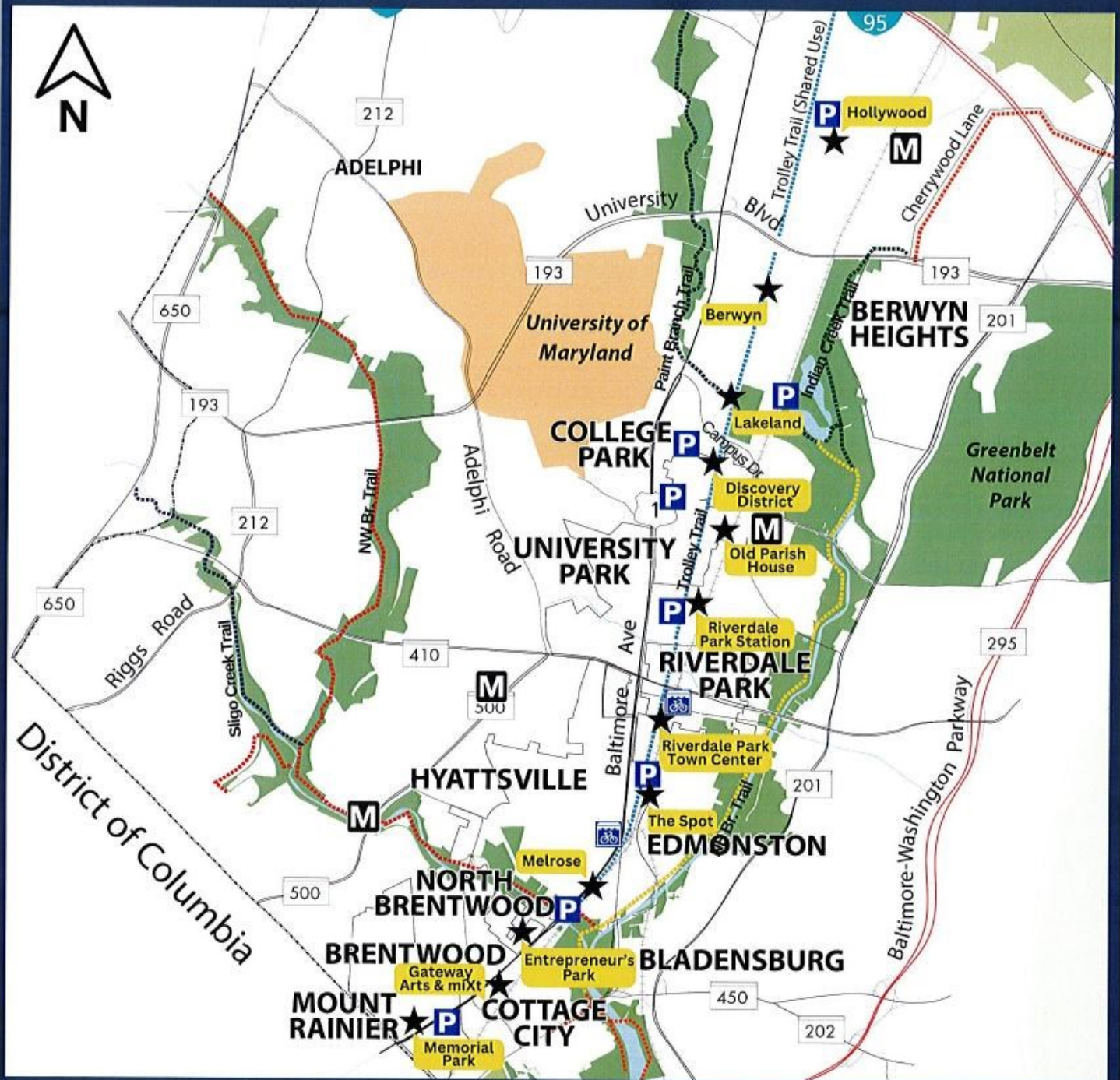

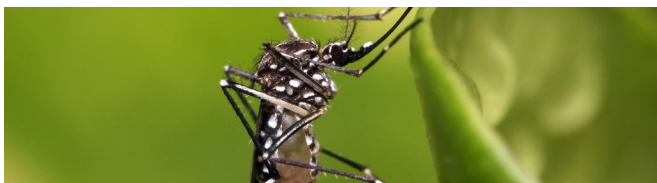
Town Rental Property License

Mosquito Control Program



North Brentwood is participating in the cooperative mosquito control program with the Maryland Department of Agriculture this year!

- Larviciding (spraying) runs through early October, once per week, Monday-Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm. Final schedule depends on larva evidence.
- Having mosquito issues? Call 301. 422-5080.

A Few Facts:

- The state cannot spray when temperatures are 90-plus, if winds are above 10 mph, or if it rains.
- The control program manages mosquitos from larvae to adult stages. Learn more at: northbrentwood.com/mosquito-control.
- Permanone 30130 poses little threat to people and pets. This EPA-approved formulation is the lowest toxicity level that controls adult mosquitoes.

Mosquito-breeding Prevention Tips

- Flush birdbaths and containers under potted plants at least twice a week. Properly dispose of old tires.
- Turn over wheelbarrows, canoes, pails, trash can lids, and any other objects that may hold water (including items stored under decks and porches).
- Keep roof gutters and downspouts clean.
- Repair dripping outdoor faucets, and draining water from tarps and grill covers.

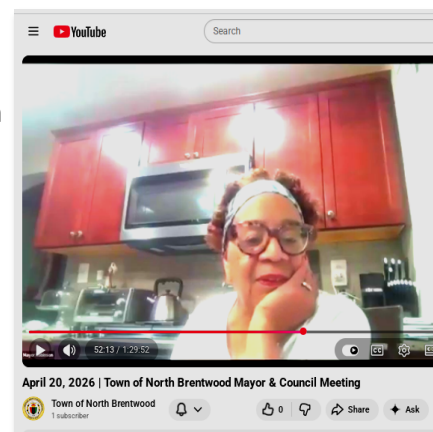
Town Meetings: Live & YouTube

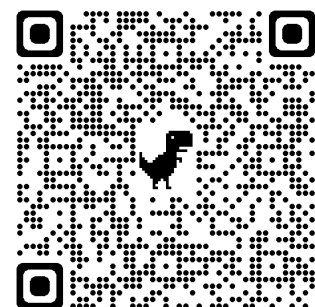

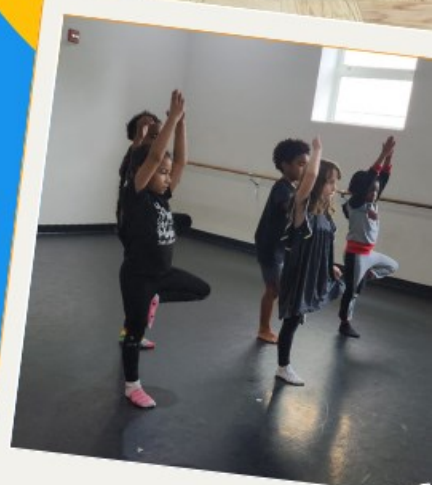

For a list of all local office and gubernatorial candidates, go to elections.maryland.gov/elections/2026/primary_candidates/index.html.

Only registered Democratic or Republican voters may vote in that party's primary election. Not sure if you're registered? Go to voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/VoterSearch to: check your mail-in or provisional ballot status, view your sample ballot, review your voter registration record, or request a duplicate voter registration card. You can also find your polling place, district and local election board.

To vote, register to online, by mail, or in person at select locations. MD also offers registration (same day) at polling places on Election Day. Be sure to bring a document proving where you live (e.g., MVA-issued license, ID card or change of address card, paycheck, bank statement, utility bill, or any government document with your name/address).

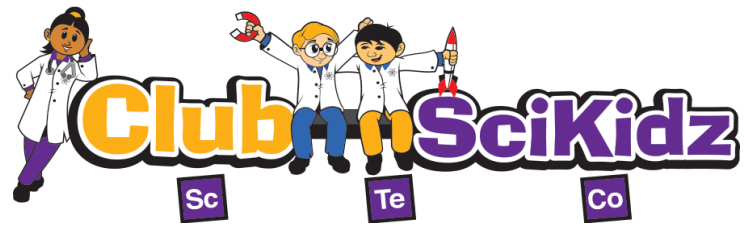
