Town of North Brentwood Approves Proposed FY 26 Budget

On April 30, the Mayor, Town Council, and staff of North Brentwood convened to review and approve the Town's proposed Fiscal Year 2026 budget, covering July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026. This critical document outlines the Town's financial priorities and ensures resources are allocated to support community development.

As part of the ongoing budget process, the Mayor and Council invite all residents to review and discuss the budget at Town Meetings:

- **May 19:** First reading of proposed budget.
- **June 2:** Second reading, followed by a **Public Hearing** where residents may voice their opinions. **Final Approval of the FY 26 Budget** will occur following the public hearing.

The Mayor and Council encourage all residents to engage in the budget process, ensuring final decisions reflect the needs and priorities of the North Brentwood community.

How to be A Good Neighbor PG County's Rules & Regulations



Violations can lead to fines up to \$5000!

DO:

- Cut grass and bag the clippings.
- Keep property free of debris.
- Keep pets on-leash.

DO NOT:

- Park cars on lawns.
- Use cones to hold parking spaces on public streets (cones placed in streets are public property and may be removed and disposed).
- Store household furniture and appliances outdoors.
- Raise/store livestock at your home.
- Operate illegal (non-permitted) businesses from your home, e.g., auto repair, restaurants— even in sheds used as living dwellings.
- Use fireworks (illegal in PG County).
- Park commercial vehicles on the street in residential neighborhoods.
- Make loud noises or play loud music at night.
- Litter — place waste in trash cans.
- Sell food/alcohol without license.
- Start construction without permits.
- Dispose of mattress or box spring without a full plastic cover.

Use these random acts of kindness to brighten your neighbor's day.

1. Say hello or wave each time you see your neighbors.
2. Bake cookies or a favorite dessert for your neighbor.
3. Cook dinner for a neighbor who is ill or just had a new baby.
4. Write a friendly message or draw a happy picture on your neighbor's sidewalk using chalk.
5. Bring in your neighbors' garbage can or offer to wash their car.
6. Leave a bottle of bubbles, a coloring book, or flowers on your neighbor's doorstep.
7. Ask an elderly neighbor if there's any particular chore you can help with.
8. Write out your favorite joke and put it in your neighbor's mailbox.
9. Offer to walk your neighbor's dog.
10. Bring out a cold drink on a hot day when you see your neighbor working outside.
11. Offer to play with your neighbor's kids for an afternoon.
12. Offer to help water the garden, rake leaves, or shovel snow.

Effective immediately, if recycling bins are found to be contaminated with items that do not belong in the recycling stream, they will ***not be picked up***. Please ensure your bins are free from plastic bags and other non-recyclable materials.

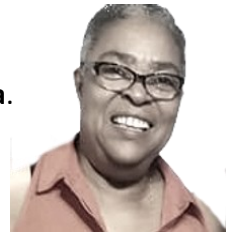
A \$100 fine will be imposed on residents *each time plastic bags are placed in recycling bins*. We want to maintain an efficient and environmentally friendly recycling program, and your cooperation is essential.

Additionally, I want to remind everyone of the importance of **upkeeping yard waste**. Please make sure to keep your yard cleared of debris, such as trash, fallen branches and leaves, and other hazards.

Also, be mindful of the proper disposal of **grass clippings**. Grass clippings should never be left on sidewalks or streets, as these can create risks for pedestrians and vehicles.

During **spring, summer and fall months**, it's vital that all residents stay on top of yard maintenance. A well-kept yard not only enhances the appearance of our community but also ensures the safety and cleanliness of our streets. Let's all do our part to keep North Brentwood looking its best!

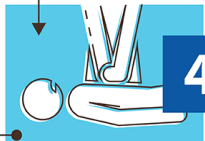

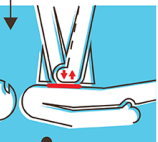
Place the palm of your hand on top of your other hand, and lace your fingers together.

Heimlich Maneuver



1. Lean the person forward slightly and stand behind him or her.



2. Make a fist with one hand.



3. Put your arms around the person and grasp your fist with your other hand near the top of the stomach, just below the center of the rib cage.



4. Make a quick, hard movement, inward and upward.

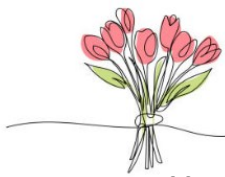

Honoring Mothers

Mother's day

Backbone of North Brentwood's Legacy

As May blooms with the warmth of spring, we pause to celebrate the women whose love, labor and leadership have shaped generations: our mothers. Mother's Day is more than just a date on the calendar. It's a time to honor the quiet strength and bold resilience of the women who hold families together, nurture futures, and stand tall through challenges with grace and grit.

Here in North Brentwood — the first African American incorporated municipality in Prince George's County — the story of motherhood is deeply interwoven with the story of our Town. From its founding families, to today's caretakers and changemakers, Black mothers in North Brentwood have always been more than nurturers. They've been protectors, educators, advocates, and community builders.

In times when resources were few and challenges were many, Black mothers here cultivated strength in the soil of love. They taught their children to walk tall in a world that didn't always see them. They led from the kitchen table and the church pew, from PTA meetings to the front lines of civic life. Through redlining, segregation, economic hardship, and societal change, mothers remained steadfast, passing down survival, along with joy, pride and purpose.

The words of abolitionist and women's rights leader Sojourner Truth still ring true today:

"If the first woman God ever made was strong enough to turn the world upside down all alone, these women together ought to be able to turn it back, and get it right side up again!"

Her words remind us Black women have always been world-shapers, and our mothers are no exception. As we celebrate *all* mothers this May, we especially honor the matriarchs of North Brentwood: past and present. Your stories are the roots of our community, your sacrifices are the foundation on which we continue to build. Thank you for showing us what resilience truly looks like, for loving fiercely and leading with your hearts.

A Message from Pepco: We're Here to Help You Manage Winter Bills This Spring

As we welcome the warmer days of spring, Pepco remains committed to supporting our customers — especially those who may still be managing higher-than-usual energy bills from the winter season. While enhanced winter assistance programs have concluded, a range of flexible payment options and energy assistance programs are still available to help ease the burden and keep your household on track.

Flexible Options to Help You Stay Current

We offer several tools to help customers manage energy bills and avoid falling behind:

- **Payment Arrangements** — Eligible residential customers with past-due balances may set up payment plans of up to *12 months*. Make a down payment on the amount owed and pay the remainder in manageable monthly installments, on top of your regular bill.
- **Budget Billing** — Take the guesswork out of monthly costs with our Budget Billing option. This program averages your electricity use over the past 12 months and spreads costs evenly throughout the year, providing a predictable monthly bill. You can enroll through My Account or by calling Customer Care.
- **High Usage Alerts and Energy Tips** — Get notified when your energy use is trending higher than normal, and access energy-saving tips to lower your bill. Alerts and tips are available through My Account and can help you manage your usage before your bill arrives.

Income-Eligible Assistance Programs in Maryland

If you are a state resident and meet income eligibility guidelines, you may qualify for additional assistance:

- **Maryland Energy Assistance Program (MEAP/LIHEAP):** This federally funded program offers up to \$750 in benefits to assist with home heating costs (July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025). Customers facing disconnection may also qualify for a Crisis Benefit of up to \$600.
 - *No need to be behind on your bill to qualify.*
 - *Funds are limited and first-come, first-served.*

- **Electric Universal Service Program (EUSP):** Eligible customers can receive assistance with current/past-due electric bills and are enrolled in Budget Billing to help manage future costs.
Maximum annual benefit: \$575.

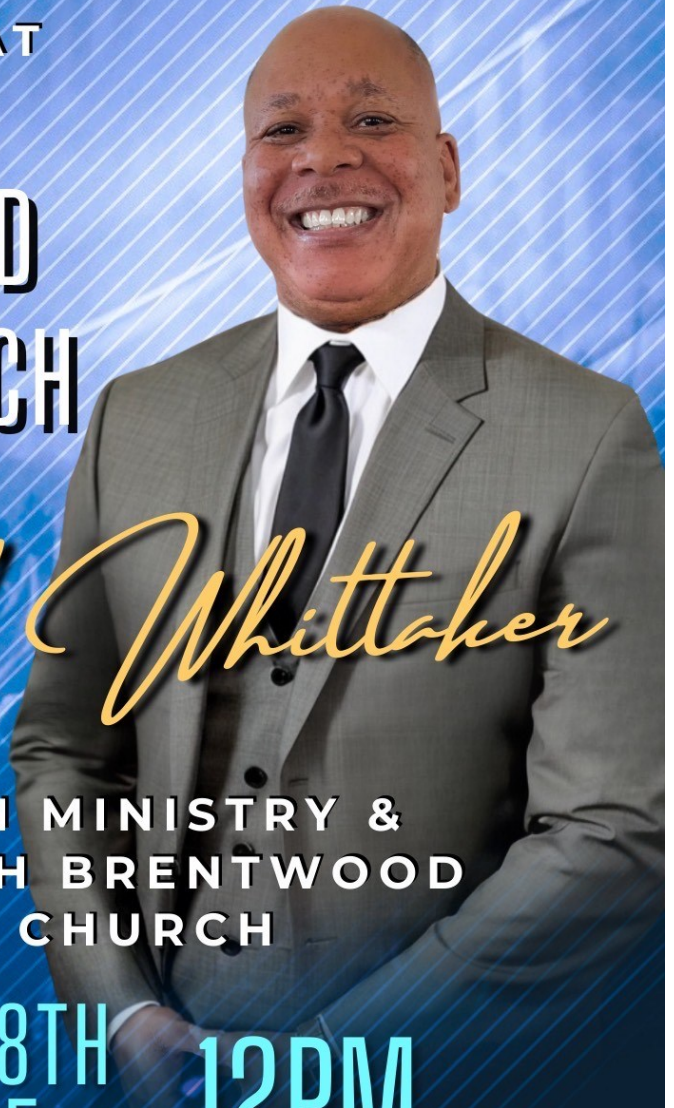
