Of course, the buzz around Town is the new state law (which went into effect on October 1) elevating fines for speeding throughout Maryland. And, North Brentwood's government is required to comply with the state's new penalty structure, ranging from \$40 to \$425 per offense.

My office released a speed citation increase memo outlining the new fees on September 17. This memo is posted on our website's Speed Violations page (northbrentwood.com/speed-violations) and it may be found on page two of this newsletter.

In addition, the Town will discuss acceptance of new tiered speeding fines at the October 6 Mayor and Council Meeting. If approved, the increases will be effective October 21, after the second reading of the Town ordinance. A copy of the proposed ordinance may

be downloaded on the Town's Meeting Agendas page (northbrentwood.com/meeting-agendas), along with the meeting agenda.



On a lighter note, I want to share my gratitude to the

Town for hosting weekly "Color-Me-Friday" events, at Sis's Tavern, throughout September. These gatherings were so much fun, with light food and music, artists and entrepreneurs celebrating our Town's history and culture. We ended the event series with a ceremony sealing the Town's 100th Anniversary time capsule, which will be dedicated and installed soon; stay tuned for details. See photos from the final Color-Me-Friday event on page three of this newsletter.

MEMORANDUM

EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2025

During the 2025 Maryland General Assembly, House Bill 182 was passed and will become effective on October 1, 2025. This bill repeals a statutory provision that set a maximum amount of \$40 — for the civil penalty imposed on the owner or driver of a motor vehicle that exceeds a posted speed limit and is recorded by a speed monitoring system.

Instead, the bill establishes an escalating penalty structure, with a maximum penalty ranging from \$40 to \$425 for the offense, depending on the excessiveness of the speed violation.

Below is the state's Penalty Structure for violations recorded by speed monitoring systems:

Exceeding the Speed Limit by	<u>Maximum Penalty</u>
12-15 MPH*, inclusive	\$40
16-19 MPH, inclusive	\$70
20-29 MPH, inclusive	\$120
30-39 MPH, inclusive	\$230
40 or move MPH	\$425

WSSC Water Assists Federal Workers Impacted by Government Shutdown

Service Turnoffs Suspended, Late Fees Waived, 'Get Current' Assistance Extended to November 30

On October 1, WSSC Water announced a series of measures to support federal employees impacted by the government shutdown. Recognizing the financial hardship caused by missed paychecks, MD's largest water utility is taking immediate steps to help ensure impacted customers continue to have access to safe, clean and reliable water and wastewater services.

For customers directly impacted by the shutdown, effective immediately, WSSC Water will:

- Temporarily suspend water service turnoffs.
- Waive late fees to ease financial pressure for affected federal workers.
- Extend enrollment in the Get Current program until November 30. The assistance program helps eligible customers with delinquent balances, as of June 1, by offering forgiveness of a portion of the balance.

"We understand these are challenging times; we are steadfast in our mission to provide uninterrupted access to essential water and wastewater services," said WSSC Water GM and CEO Kishia L. Powell. "Our goal is to help safeguard the health and well-being of our customers who, through no fault of their own, suddenly find themselves without a paycheck."

In addition to these temporary relief measures, WSSC Water offers *financial assistance programs*, such as *PromisePay*, which allows residential and commercial customers, with past-due bills, to establish affordable, flexible and interest-free payment plans. This program is designed to make it easier for customers to manage their payments without added financial stress.

WSSC says it's committed to supporting these dedicated public servants, and others in our community facing economic challenges. The firm's current budget has nearly \$9 million in assistance for income-constrained customers – a 14 percent increase over last year.

Council Meeting Notes: September 15

Your Mayor and Council met on September 15, to discuss community updates, programs, and upcoming events. Here are some of the key takeaways:

Hispanic Heritage Month

North Brentwood observed Hispanic Heritage Month, September 15 to October 15, with programming at two of the Town's Color-Me-Friday events honoring the contributions of Hispanic and Latino Americans. Chill Beats & Chilly Treats had music by MeLinda Mendoza and Spoken Word and Salsa featured poems and tacos.

Community Reminders

- Residents are reminded to keep yards neat and obtain permits for exterior home improvements.
- Proper wood storage is required. Residents should prepare yards for the fall and holidays.
- The Town continues to issue notices for uncut grass, rubbish, and abandoned vehicles.

Public Safety & Services

- Residents were urged to stay cautious following recent ICE activities in the area.
- Sandbags remain available at the Town Office to help prepare for storms. It's still hurricane season.
- Mr. Smallwood's reliable and reasonably-priced snow removal services will continue.
- The Town has allocated \$2,750 toward a public safety Trap-Neuter-Release program to help curb the stray cat population. Progress has been slower than expected, but efforts are ongoing.

Fire Department Updates

- The Brentwood Fire Department's Open House on Saturday, October 11, will featuring safety demos, CPR training and (pending approval) food trucks.
- The department currently has 33 members and is actively training new applicants.
- Repair of station elevator is pending (with county).

Programs & Services

• SHARE food program costs are now \$30/person. The Town is exploring partnerships to help offset costs.

 The Town supported residents this month with stormwater management improvements through Maryland's Nuisance Flooding Blitz program.

Community Events

- September events included Color-Me-Friday nights, the annual cookout, senior activities, trunk-or-treat preparations, and Community Center karate classes.
- The Town Time Capsule was sealed during the final Color-Me-Friday event on September 26.

Looking Ahead

- The Time Capsule dedication will be announced soon.
- Several Town officials will attend the Maryland Municipal League Fall Conference, in McHenry, MD, from October 12 to October 14.
- The next Mayor and Council meetings are scheduled for Monday, October 6 and Monday, October 20.

New Laws in MD Go Into Effect Oct 1

Many new laws go into effect on Oct 1 in Maryland and the DC area, including changes to driving, cannabis, criminal justice reform and prescription drug disposal.

Cannabis

A *new law* allows those 21 years-plus to "manufacture a personal use amount of cannabis products/concentrated cannabis for personal use or adult sharing at a private residence" — if "volatile solvents" are not used in the process. Distributing large amounts is still a felony. The law also raises controlled substances felony thresholds and increases penalties for large-scale distribution.

Criminal Law

The "Organized Retail Crime Law," creates a "clear definition of organized retail crime, enables statewide data collection, and allows theft to be aggregated across jurisdictions, closing a critical loophole long exploited by criminals." Law enforcement can track repeat offenders/combine offenses across counties.

Another law decreases the amount of time a person can file to have criminal charges expunged. It allows a certain amount of time to file a petition after the completion of a sentence, and it adds to the list of misdemeanor convictions a person may expunge. The law also does not allow Maryland Judiciary Case Search to show a charge of possession of cannabis if the conviction was later pardoned by the governor.

The "Second Look Act," requires the Maryland Parole Commission to consider the age of incarcerated people when deciding whether or not to grant parole.

Driving

Starting Oct 1, automated cameras across the state will begin mailing out tiered tickets based on how much above the speed limit you're driving. The new tier structure was passed by the Maryland General Assembly and signed by Gov. Wes Moore in May.

Another new law *expands what counts as reckless or aggressive driving*. Speeding 30-plus mph over the speed limit is "reckless driving" and adds six points to

a driver's record, a fine of \$1,000 and a jail sentence, or both. Two points will be added to a driver's record for negligent driving and that fine has increased to \$750.

Eric's ID Law means drivers can choose "non-apparent disability" to be added to a license. This opts drivers into a program that will place a butterfly emblem on their state ID/driver's license. It indicates that license or ID holder has a disability not immediately obvious, which could include deafness, autism, developmental disabilities, or a mental health issue.

Prescription Drug Disposal

A new law changes the "Prescription Drug Repository Program." It allows other states to participate, includes OTC drugs to be donated, and clarifies which patients are eligible to receive the donated drugs.

Landlords & Tenants

A new law *prohibits a penalty in excess of 5%* of unpaid rent, rather than the amount due.

Another law stops certain cooperative housing corporations from prohibiting/restricting creation or operation of certain family child care homes.

Landlords will now be required to provide tenants with at least 24 hours written notice before entering leased premises, except in an emergency.





This Walktober, we encourage families to walk together, neighbors to check on each other, and all residents to enjoy the paths and green spaces that make North Brentwood special. Together, let's keep North Brentwood moving, one step at a time.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month: Let's Talk About Elder Abuse

Each October, communities across the nation recognize Domestic Violence Awareness Month, a time to shed light on abuse that too often stays hidden. While many think of domestic violence as something that happens only between partners, abuse can also deeply affect one of our most vulnerable populations: older adults.

Elder abuse is any intentional act — or failure to act — by a caregiver, or trusted individual, that causes harm or risk of harm to an older person. It can take many forms, including:

- Physical abuse. Hitting, pushing or using unnecessary force.
- **Emotional abuse**. Threats, insults or controlling behavior that causes fear or isolation.
- Financial abuse. Misusing or stealing money, property or benefits.
- Neglect. Failing to provide food, medicine, care, or safety.

Sadly, elder abuse often occurs behind closed doors, sometimes at the hands of those closest to the victim. Because many older adults can be very reliant on others (e.g., family members, caregivers or neighbors), they may feel unable to speak out, or may not realize help is available.

As a community, we all have a role to play. If you have an older loved one, check in with them regularly. Listen for changes in mood or behavior. Look for signs such as unexplained injuries, sudden financial troubles, or withdrawal from social activities. And, most importantly, speak up if something doesn't feel right.

North Brentwood is a Town built on care and respect. During Domestic Violence Awareness Month, let's extend that commitment to our seniors by raising awareness, supporting resources, and creating safe spaces for everyone to live with independence and dignity. If you suspect elder abuse, contact PG County's Adult Protective Services at 301.909.2228. Help is available — and speaking up can save a life.
