



Mayor's Message



Here in North Brentwood, we are more than just a town—we are a legacy. One of the oldest African American-incorporated communities in this nation, built on resilience, unity, and people showing up for one another.

Today, we have more ways than ever to connect. Social media allows us to share, comment and react in seconds. And, while it can be a helpful tool, we must be honest—it is not a replacement for real community involvement.

A post cannot replace a presence.

A comment cannot replace a conversation.

And a “like” cannot replace leadership.

Real decisions about our own—our safety, our growth, our future—are not made online. Sound decisions are made when we gather and attend meetings, when we ask questions, and when we work together face-to-face.

When we rely only on social media, we risk misunderstanding one another. We risk spreading incomplete information. And most importantly, we risk losing the very thing that has sustained North Brentwood for generations: our personal connection.

Not everyone in our community is online. But everyone deserves to be heard.

If we want to honor the legacy of those who built this Town, we must do more than post: we must participate. We must sit at the table, engage in respectful dialogue, and we must be willing to be part of the solution.

Social media can inform us—but it cannot replace us.

So I encourage each of you: come to Town meetings, join the conversations, volunteer your time, and continue building the strong, united community that North Brentwood has always been.

Because our future will not be decided by what we post—it will be shaped by what we do, together.

Public Safety

North Brentwoodians' safety is one of the most critical responsibilities we have as a town. In a small community like ours—without a local police department—we have to be **forward-thinking, intentional and proactive** about protecting residents.

That's why we are using cameras from Turing AI. Let me be clear: this is not about surveillance—it's about **prevention, accountability and support.**

These cameras are placed only in **public areas**—our streets and entrances. Cameras' presence alone can help **discourage crime** like theft, vandalism and illegal dumping. When something *does* happen, cameras provide critical information that **helps county law enforcement respond faster and more effectively.**

We cannot afford to simply react after problems occur. We must use the tools available to us to **stay ahead of issues and protect what matters most—our people, our homes and our community.**

At the same time, we understand trust is essential. That's why we are committed to **clear, transparent policies**—defining exactly how footage is used, who has access, and how long data is retained. There will be **accountability every step of the way.**

Using surveillance cameras in public areas is not about replacing law enforcement—it is about **strengthening our ability to work with them.**

Moreover, we cannot afford a Town police department unless you, as citizens, are committed to paying for it through a hefty increase in your property taxes. At minimum, a full police department would cost approximately \$500,000-plus annually: more than \$2,232 a year from each of the Town's 224 households.

Most importantly, the use of cameras in public spaces is about being responsible stewards of this community—taking **smart, cost-effective steps** to enhance safety without compromising the values we all share.

We are committed to listening, to being transparent, and to moving forward together.

Public Safety: Rotavirus on the Rise per CDC

Rotavirus rates have steadily increased since January. In the CDC's Northeast region, which includes Maryland, positive tests spiked to 9.6 percent for the week of April 11, up from 3.23 percent the week before.



The rise in cases comes amid debates about vaccine policy and recommendations. Earlier this year, federal health officials removed the rotavirus vaccine from the routine childhood immunization schedule—drawing criticism from pediatricians and public health experts who fear it could further reduce vaccination rates.

Rotavirus spreads very easily: it usually passes person to person, when tiny amounts of stool from an infected person get into someone else's mouth (via hands, toys, surfaces, food, water). Infants/toddlers are at high risk.

Why is rotavirus so dangerous? It can result in severe dehydration, often requiring hospitalization. Symptoms include frequent vomiting, watery diarrhea, lethargy, reduced urination, and fever; it may last about a week (longer than norovirus). There is no specific treatment for rotavirus, other than preventing dehydration through fluids. Health officials continue to urge parents to consult pediatricians about vaccination.

Town of North Brentwood Proposed FY27 Budget

On April 18, North Brentwood’s Mayor, Town Council, and Treasurer convened a workshop to draft the Town’s proposed Fiscal Year 2027 budget, covering July 1, 2026, to June 30, 2027. This critical document outlines the Town's financial priorities and ensures resources are allocated to support community development.

As part of the budget process, all residents are encouraged to attend upcoming Town Meetings:

- May 4: First reading of proposed budget.
- May 18: Second reading, followed by a Public Hearing where residents may voice their opinions. Adjustments to the proposed budget, based on residents’ feedback, will be made before the final budget is approved.
- June 1: Final approval of the FY27 Budget will occur on Monday, June 1st.

The Mayor and Council encourage all residents to engage in the budget process, ensuring final decisions reflect the needs and priorities of the North Brentwood community.

Maryland Primary Election 2026



MD's primary gives you a say in what happens next across our state.

Open seats include: Governor, Lt.

Governor, Attorney General, State Senators and Congressional representatives, House of Delegates, Comptroller, and Judge of the Circuit Court. In PG County, citizens will vote for the County Executive, as well as At-Large and District Councilmembers.

For a list of all local office and gubernatorial candidates, go to elections.maryland.gov/elections/2026/primary_candidates/index.html.

Only registered Democratic or Republican voters may vote in that party's primary election. Not sure if you're registered? Go to voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/VoterSearch to: check your mail-in or provisional ballot status, view your sample ballot, review your voter registration record, or request a duplicate voter registration card. You can also find your polling place, district and local election board.

To vote, register to online, by mail, or in person at select locations. MD also offers registration (same day) at polling places on Election Day. Be sure to bring a document proving where you live (e.g., MVA-issued license, ID card or change of address card, paycheck, bank statement, utility bill, or any government document with your name/address).

Gateway Open Studios Tour:

Four Towns, One Community, 200 Artists



On Saturday, May 9, from 12 to 5 pm, the public is invited to explore the vibrant art community, in the towns of North Brentwood, Mount Rainier,

Brentwood, and Hyattsville, that comprise Maryland's Gateway Arts District. Best of all, it's a free event!

On this one day, artists' studios are open at the same time. All-day parking is available at Hyattsville Judicial Center garage (5000 Rhode Island Ave). Visit gatewaycdc.org/ost2026 for a map of participating artists/studios to plan your tour.



Gateway Arts District is the largest in the region, but it's easy to underestimate: many of its artists work in spaces tucked away or without public hours. An exciting element of this event is that visitors can see spaces not always open, view artists' work and workspaces, and talk to the artists about their practices.

The Arts District roughly encompasses two miles, from Mt. Rainier to Hyattsville, with most locations on or around Route 1/Rhode Island Ave. While some intrepid art-goers choose to walk, **free shuttles will run along the corridor to help people cover more ground.**

In addition to visual arts, many neighboring businesses will be poised to welcome visitors for food, drink, and further discovery of the many small, creative places in the Gateway Arts District. Enjoy locally brewed beer at Franklin's or Streetcar 82, or grab lunch at Pennyroyal Station or one of the food trucks popping up that day.

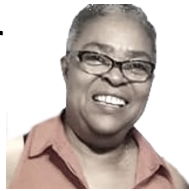

(County Permit Also Required)

Projects That Do Not Require a Town Permit

1. Window replacement
2. Door replacement

4. Permit Fees
5. \$50 per project

All approved permits must be clearly displayed in a front window and visible from the street during the project period.
